investigate for themselves at odds with the power and forces that held humanity in sway. The Knights Templar of the 12th century educated in the knowledge found within the ancient catacombs of the ruins of Solomon's temple complex, began the most spectacular developments in architecture of the time, known today as the Gothic cathedrals of Europe.
